GRANDPARENT SCAM IN SOUTH HURON RESULTS IN \$40,000 LOSS

(SOUTH HURON, ON) - The Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) would like to remind the public to hang on to their hard-earned money after a South Huron resident fell victim to the "Grandparent Scam" in early March.

On March 20th, Huron OPP was contacted by an elderly South Huron resident who advised that they had been scammed out of \$40,000 during the first week of March 2023. The victim explained to police that they had received a phone call from someone stating that they were an RCMP officer and had the victim's grandson in custody following a motor vehicle collision where drugs and a gun were seized. The scammer told the victim to send \$8,000 in cash by courier to have their loved one released on bail. The victim complied, sending the money.

Following this, the victim received another call from the scammer who advised that the victim needed to send an additional \$32,000 for their grandson to be released from jail. The victim sent the larger sum by way of a wire transfer. The scammer made further calls to the victim advising them that the matter was still before the courts.

The victim contacted the OPP when they realized they had been scammed.

In 2022, according to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC), fraud reports totalled a staggering **\$530** million in victim losses. This was nearly a **40%** increase from the 2021, unprecedented **\$380** million in losses. It is estimated that only **5-10%** of victims report scams and frauds to the CAFC or law enforcement.

How to protect yourself?

- Don't give out your personal information (name, address, DOB, SIN, banking credentials).
- Don't accept friend requests from people you do not know.
- Don't invest your money in platforms provided by people you don't know.
- Be careful who you share images with. Suspects will often use explicit pictures to extort victims into sending more money.
- Protect your online accounts.
- Never send money to someone you haven't met.

- Don't respond to text messages from phone numbers you do not recognize.
- Learn more tips and tricks for protecting yourself.

If you fall victim to a fraud or know someone who has, contact your local police service to report the crime and report it to the CAFC at **1-888-495-8501** or online on the <u>Fraud Reporting System (FRS)</u>, even if a financial loss did not occur.
