6. O.P.P. Report

- Detailed report for December was distributed prior to the meeting for review and to allow for effective discussion at the Board meeting
- Inspector Younan provided a comprehensive overview and explanation of the report for the month
- Further clarification was provided for each category
- Happy New Year to the Board members and attending guest, Stacey Jeffery
- E-Tickets issued 61 in 2023 and 83 in 2022
- E-Warn 37 in 2023 compared to 38 in 2022
- Focus patrols No specific focus patrols held in December
- Community mobilization activities 5.5 hours
- Community services incidents 10 hours
- Foot patrol hours 2.75 hours
- Cruiser patrols 393.5 hours
- Continue to be pledged with significant thefts at area businesses high value items are being stolen – charges have been laid – videos shared through social media has assisted with arrests – community has been supportive in solving crimes by identifying individuals responsible for these crimes
- 26% clearance rates on property crimes attributes to the excellent work of Officers
- On line frauds continue and will ramp up with tax time media surrounding this issue will increase to assist in awareness and prevention
- 311 occurrences in the month of December map provides a visual of the location of occurrences
- 1,200 R.I.D.E. programs were conducted throughout the County in 2023
- R.I.D.E. programs increased this year over last 42 were held in 2023 compared to 21 in 2022
- Grants are provided for the R.I.D.E. programs
- December Media Release Inspector Younan expanded on the resources and support that are provided to victims of indecent acts composite sketch to assist in determining the individual responsible
- In 2022, the Crime Severity Index relative to Violent Crime for Huron County increased

- An analysis of 2023 regarding violent crime, Intimate Partner Violence along with Sexual Assaults and Assaults have increased
- Contributing factors include enhanced training to police officers who investigate with a trauma informed and victim centered approach, which facilitates more criminal allegation disclosures to police
- As trust with victims increases, this increases disclosure of violent crimes
- Challenges related to homelessness continue to contribute to Assault occurrences
- County and Municipalities continue to support initiatives in multiple locations to assist with these pressures
- All of this has resulted in an increase in approximately 1,000 hours for South Huron, as noted in the Calls for Service Billing Summary Report
- Chair Dietirch questioned Inspector Younan on the results of the Speed Spy analysis pertaining to Morrison Line
- Inspector Younan noted that the average speed was 92.7 km/hour and therefore would not warrant additional police resource, unless the Board wished a focused patrol on Morrison Line
- The 145 km/hour reading was potentially Police responding to an occurrence
- Chair Dietrich thanked Inspector Younan for providing the overview and explanation to the Board
